



WINES



Burgundy



The roots of Burgundy are the roots of French history. It was early monks who planted the first vineyards, studied variations of soils and terroir, mapped the Côte d'Or and invented the idea of cru. Modern Burgundian growers might own several small plots of vines in many different villages; the lots from each are vinified and bottled into separate wines. Burgundy is known for many expressions of two great varietals: Pinot Noir and Chardonnay along other minor varieties.

Chablis

Chablis, one of the most famous white wines in the world, is a tiny collection of hillside vineyards at the extreme northern end of Burgundy made from Chardonnay. Traditionally, true Chablis is steely, minerally and bone-dry, due to the climate of the region which is downright cold, and the limestone soils, which, like chalk, encourage acidity in the wine.

Côte de Nuits

The Côtes de Nuits is the northern section, beginning on the outskirts of Dijon, with the town of Nuits-St-Georges at the center. It is 12 miles long, with 3500 acres of sloping vineyards, planted mostly with Pinot Noir. The best vineyard sites face east or southeast and are a mixture of limestone, clay and marl.

Côte de Beaune

The Côtes de Beaune begins where the "Nuits" ends at the hill of Corton. The area is roughly double that of its neighbour, with about 7500 planted acres, and gentler in slope. Most of the wine is Pinot Noir, but this is where you'll also find the classic white Burgundies from Chardonnay that thrives where the limestone breaks through.

Bordeaux



Bordeaux is one of France's largest and most diverse wine regions. A vast variety of wines are made here: red, dry white and sweet white. The red wines of Bordeaux, all made with a blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Merlot, Petit Verdot & Malbec varieties, are arguably the world's most famous reds. The blends would differ in every Château to create their unique, signature style. However, reds from the left bank are predominantly Cabernet Sauvignon dominated, meanwhile at the right bank, the Merlot has the lead. Sauternes, the archetypal sweet white wine is made from a blend of Semillon, Sauvignon Blanc and Muscadelle, as are other dry white wines.

Alsace



Alsace is located in the north-eastern part of France, just across the Rhine River from Germany. Although Alsace and Germany grow many of the same grapes. Riesling and Gewürztraminer from the region are mostly dry, while many German wines are mediumdry to sweet. Alsace is about 110 kilometres long, one to five kilometres wide. It produces one-fifth of all AOC wines and all Alsace wines are 100% varietals, with no blend permitted.

Loire



The rich history of the Loire vineyards dates back to the Roman times, but it was the monks of the Benedictine order who revived grape, growing during the 7th Century close to Nantes. The Loire River is the longest river in France with a length of 1000 km, it boasts a variety of soils and climate, from continental in the east to maritime in the west and produces a correspondingly varied number of wines and styles.

Rhône



The Rhône Valley stretches for 140 miles from Lyon to Avignon and is divided into two. The wines of the north and south are as dramatically different as the climate and the landscape. The warm-weather wines of the south tend to be thick, dark, rich blends of as many as nine different red grape varieties. In the cooler north, fragrant Viognier of Condrieu and the exotic Marsanne/Roussanne blend of white Hermitage are among the elegant whites. Red Hermitage, made from Syrah, is one of the world's great wines.





ITALY

Tuscany



In the heart of Italy lies its most well-recognized region: Tuscany. Chianti is a large wine zone extending through much of Tuscany. All of the zone is DOCG status, and it is divided into seven districts. The second great red wine of Tuscany is Brunello di Montalcino DOCG, from the town of the same name just south of the Chianti district. Brunello is a local term referring to the grape variety Sangiovese. These wines are of superior quality and limited production.



Super Tuscans



The Super Tuscan phenomenon began in the 1970's when some producers decided to get attention by creating a new style of wine. The wines are called Super Tuscans either because they are produced outside the Chianti zone, or because their grape blends include varieties (Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Syrah, Cabernet Franc) that do not conform to the DOC requirements for Chianti. Although the blends differ from producer to producer, what these wines do have in common is their expensive price tags.

Piedmont



Piedmont produces what most describe as Italy's best red wines. Within Piedmont, there are 38 DOC/G zones and 43 distinct types of wine. Several of the well-known DOCG wines come from Piedmont. Barolo DOCG is a rich and powerful wine made from the Nebbiolo grape. Just like Barbaresco DOCG, also made from Nebbiolo grape and named after the town and the area of the same name.

The northeastern most region of Italy is home to three important wine regions once known as Tre Venezie (Three Venices) because they were all part of the Venetian kingdom. Wines from the area surrounding the town of Verona include the white Soave, the sparkler Prosecco and the reds Valpolicella and Bardolino. The area Breganze, homes some vineyards in the foothills of the Alps and some on the gravelly plain to the north of the city of Vicenze, produces a variety of international and Italian grapes.

Some experts claim that centrally located Ribera del Duero, Spain's fastest growing wine region, has the greatest potential for memorable red wines. Ribera del Duero Tempranillos are tannic and long-lived, usually inky and robust, with complexed aromas of chocolate, plums and smoke. French varietals Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Malbec are joining the native varietals.

La Rioja Alta 904

The Rioja River valley in northeast of Spain is the country's most prosperous and best-known table wine region. The area parallels the River Ebro, which runs south to the Mediterranean and is intersected by the smaller Rio Oja. The region is sub-divided into three areas: Rioja Alta, Rioja Alavesa, and Rioja Baja. The Alta and Alavesa areas produce more aromatic, balanced wines. They have similar climates and soils and face each other across the northern stretch of the River Ebro, while the Rioja Baja lies downstream and is somewhat warmer, producing slightly lower acidity, less balanced wines.



The earliest California grapevines were planted in what is now downtown Los Angeles. As the padres blazed a trail up the coast of California, they planted grapes at each of their missions in order to make sacramental wine. California and sunny weather seem to go hand in hand, in truth some of California's best vineyards are downright chilly, cooled by the moderating influences of fog and wind from the Pacific Ocean. Cool mornings and evenings in these vineyards balance with hot days under the California sun. While the variety of terroirs might indicate a similarly large range of grapes, California's success has been found on relatively few: Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Pinot Noir, Zinfandel, Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc.

While new techniques in the wineries have improved quality, the biggest opportunities lie in reducing yields and improving viticultural techniques. New plantings in cooler areas hold great promise for some of the more classic European varietals.

Worldwide, winemakers and oenophiles alike are paying serious attention as Australian wines, once appreciated mostly for their low prices, get better and more varied all the time.

New Zealand



A diverse climate, widely varying soils and the effects of Prohibition long restrained this Pacific island country's natural suitability for wine production. Not until the mid-1980's did it produce wines of sufficient quality and quantity to attract international attention, when highly aromatic Marlborough Sauvignon Blancs first gave outsiders a hint of this area's startling potential. 
